When did it happen?	4 th August 2020		
Who experienced it?	Manufacturing Operation		
Where did it happen?	Manufacturing Plant - Sweden		
What material was involved?	Hot concentrated Ammonium Nitrate solution		
What happened?	When unloading Ammonium Nitrate solution from a tanker into the manufacturing plant's storage tank, the camlock hose end at the truck disconnected, causing the driver (unloader) to be splashed with solution. The driver was able to promptly use a Safety Shower and summon assistance.		
Why did it happen – theory?	The camlock fitting was slightly worn, and the camlock arms were not secured, which lead to the hose disconnecting under pressure. The driver's PPE was not appropriate for the material, as it did not protect him from the hot solution.		
What was the impact?	The driver was admitted to hospital with burns to his hands, arms and lower body.
